

COUNTRY: THAILAND Program Management Unit for Human Resources & Institutional Development, Research and Innovation (PMU-B)

PMU-B participates in the following thematic areas of the 2025 JFS Call for Research Proposals (10th Call):

Thematic Areas:

- 1. Climate Resilient, Smart Agriculture using Al and IoT
 - a. Climate Science
 - i. Climate modelling and impact assessment
 - ii. Adaptation strategies for agriculture
 - iii. Weather forecasting and early warning systems
 - b. Environmental Science
 - i. Land use and biodiversity conservation
 - ii. Carbon footprint and emissions tracking
 - iii. Water resource management
 - c. Computer Science & Engineering
 - i. Artificial Intelligence (AI) and Machine Learning (ML)
 - ii. Internet of Things (IoT) and sensor networks
 - iii. Data analytics and geospatial technologies

Note: All submitted proposals must be aligned with PMU-B's mission and strategic priorities. Only proposals that reflect PMU-B's mandate in human resource development, research excellence, and international collaboration will be considered eligible.

Eligibility and funding modalities

- 1) The proposal **must have** the researchers from Thailand <u>at least 2 different institutes or universities</u> to cooperate with.
- 2) Lead Applicants in Thailand must be;
 - Researchers and/or university professors/instructors (Thai/Non-Thai researchers) who work in public/non-profit organization research institute or university in Thailand and are competent in conducting research with international partners.
 - The project leader must hold a doctoral degree or equivalent, possess a record of high-quality research, and be employed at a higher education institution or government agency in Thailand. Additionally, neither the project leader nor any of the research team members may have been involved in any violation of research ethics.
 - A project leader is an individual with expertise who is affiliated with a government research unit or a higher education institution nationwide and has a research track record that demonstrates their practical knowledge and abilities.
 - The project leader should have publications in international academic journals as a
 Corresponding or First Author, with <u>at least 5 publications in the past 5 years</u> or
 as specified by PMU-B.
- 3) The proposal topic must directly <u>address the topic outlined in the call</u> for proposals (PMU-B).
- 4) The budget must stay within the specified limits.

Eligible cost categories

The maximum funding allocated per <u>project is up to 2,500,000 THB</u> for the project with the maximum of two years. It should be noted that the approved budget may be revised or reduced should any unforeseen situations arise in the future. The following costs are eligible:



Personnel costs

 Costs for scientists or student research assistants can be covered for the whole period of the project if their work is clearly related to the research project. Total personnel costs should not exceed 30% of total budget, excluding equipment costs.

Mobility of scientists and experts

- Round-trip economy class tickets to the project partner countries
- o Airport transfer costs upon presentation of a receipt
- Visa costs
- Accommodation costs

Note: All international travel-related expenses **should comply with the regulations and policies of the applicant's home institution**.

Equipment

 Equipment costs may be allowed on a limited scale. Details and specifications are required to be provided with full justification.

Consumables

- Consumable costs include laboratory chemicals and materials, but do not include office supplies such as paper, stationery, etc.
- o Consumable costs are to be spent in Thailand.

Overheads

The institutional overhead fee <u>must not exceed 10 percent of the total project budget</u>, which refers to the overall operational budget of the project, excluding the following budget categories: 1) Equipment procurement 2) Overseas travel expenses and 3) Exhibition expenses.

Additional regulations

Submission in addition to PT-Outline submission

- Thai Project leaders must also submit the "PMU-B Full Proposal" via NRIIS: https://nriis.go.th
 - a. Thai project leader must fill in the proposal details in the NRIIS system.
 - b. For the budget section, please fill in the budget details that the Thai applicant will be requesting from PMU-B.
 - c. Thai project leader must attach documents;
 - i. Full proposal: PMU-B Proposal Form
 - ii. Letter of Support (LOS): Researchers from each participating institution in Thailand must have a letter of support from their home institution, signed by an authorized representative of the institution/organization (P.S. The format and content of LOS forms can vary from one institution to another. Please contact your institution for guidance on completing their LOS form)
 - **iii. Supporting Documents** e.g. Thailand Project Leader CV, or Letters of support from Associated Partners (if any)
 - iv. Any additional documents (if any)

Each proponent that requests funding from a JFS funder must carefully read the respective National Regulations and contact the National Focal Point for an informal eligibility pre-check before submission.

Before submission, it is advisable that each partner also reads the National Regulations of the other partners in the consortium, to understand and fit-in to the criteria specified in the partners' National Regulations.
